REQUIREMENTS

As a member of the Boy Scouts of America teach the Totin' Chip to a Scout using a hand ax. Then study chapter 6 in the *Fieldbook* and, using a $\frac{3}{4}$ ax, demonstrate to your Scout leader or other qualified person designated by him the following:

1. Cut a log 6-8 feet long and 4 inches or more in diameter into 2-foot lengths. Then split these 2-foot lengths into quarters.
2. With official approval and supervision do one of the following: (a) Clear trails or fire lanes for 2 hours. (b) Demonstrate how to fell a standing tree 4 inches or more at the butt. Lop branches, make brush pile; cut tree into 2-foot lengths and stack. (c) Trim a down tree, cut into 4-foot lengths and stack; make brush pile of smaller branches.

Note: 1 and 2b should be done in one operation.
